1. [Albert Hunt Trust](#) - UK registered charities for projects that promote and enhance physical and mental welfare, including for hospice appeals and homeless appeals.
2. [Ancaster Trust](#) - UK charitable organisations undertaking medical, social welfare or community projects.
3. [Andor Charitable Trust](#) - registered charities involved in medical research, the arts and various educational activities in the UK.
4. [Awards for All \(Big Lottery\)](#) - community projects aimed at developing skills, improving health, revitalising the local environment and enabling people to become more active citizens.
5. [Barchester Healthcare Foundation](#) - small local UK groups and charities to improve the quality of life, where health and/or social care needs cannot be met by the statutory public sector or by the individual.

14. **D M Charitable Trust** - charitable organisations that offer relief of poverty and sickness and/or advance the education of the Orthodox Jewish religion in England or Israel.
15. **D M Thomas Foundation for Young People - Central Grants** - registered charities that are working with young people (up to 25 years) for projects that focus on children and young people with disabilities, who are sick in hospital or who are life limited.
16. **D'Oyly Carte Charitable Trust UK** - registered charities working in the UK in the areas of the arts, health and medical welfare, and improvement or protection of the environment.
17. **Elton John Aids Foundation - Robert Key Memorial Fund** - small one-off grants are available for frontline groups in the UK that help people with HIV in vulnerable or marginalised communities.
18. **Emerton-Christie Charity** - registered charities undertaking education, health or social welfare projects throughout the UK.
19. **Ernest Kleinwort Charitable Trust\_** - UK registered charities for charitable work in Sussex; wildlife and environmental conservation (UK and international); and reproductive health (international).
20. **Felicity Wilde Charitable Trust\_** - charitable organisations in the UK undertaking projects for the benefit of children and for medical research.
21. **Four Daughters Charitable Trust\_** - projects, organisations or ideas that can make a systemic impact to improve ageing in the UK.

28. **Heart Research UK and SUBWAY Healthy Heart Grants\_** - new, original and innovative projects that promote a healthy heart and help to prevent, or reduce, the risk of heart disease.
29. **Hedley Foundation\_** - small UK registered charities working with young people in recreation, sport, training, health and welfare, support and outdoor education of young people.

30. **Hilden Charitable Fund** - UK charities; homelessness, penal affairs, asylum seekers and refugees, disadvantaged young people and projects in developing countries working on community development, education, and health (with particular interest in girls and women). Both project and general running costs.
31. **Homelands Charitable Trust** - UK registered charities - protection and care of children, hospices, medical research and the promotion of the New Church.
32. **Hospital Saturday Fund** - registered medically related charities in the UK and Republic of Ireland for medical capital projects, medical care or research, medical training and running costs.

43. **NHS England - Celebrating Involvement in Healthcare Community Grants** - voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations in England to share examples of good practice where involving patients and the public in the work of the NHS have improved services.
44. **Oak Trust** - registered UK charities that are supporting people who are disadvantaged, medical and environmental charities. Preference for small charities (under £1m).
45. **Peoples Health Trust** - active communities programme, for smaller local community organisations in England, Scotland and Wales to help create a society without health inequalities.
