


Chairman

I believe the TCF team has done some great work in 2024. It has been a challenging year for many charities and organisations, but we have done our best to support Charity Leaders in every way possible, be this via our Angels Den, CHAT, the numerous workshops and seminars we delivered or the circa £340K we released in grant funding to charities during the year.

Our CHAT volunteers responded to over 55 requests for direct support, and I am grateful to our CEO and CHAT volunteers for their continued and generous support in giving both their time and expertise in helping those Charity Leaders who have requested assistance. I am also aware of some bespoke support from people and organisations outside the CHAT Programme and I'd like to extend my sincere thanks to them also.

With our re-established Family Angels Programme, we are continuing to develop the terrific network of Community Advocates (37), who have provided us with the meaningful opportunity to support those families classed as most vulnerable. We would not be able to do this work if it were not for their dedication and perseverance (Thank You) in helping those who need it most. For the record we have helped 126 families in 2024 providing £90,000 in the way of small personal grants that change lives. We are proud to have continued with our partner Buckinghamshire Council in supporting the Proud of Bucks awards, something we jointly instigated under COVID, and have funded ever since. We have again worked with 16 Community Boards to bring the 2024 awards out to their communities. These highlighted the work delivered through various community-based organisations and was a way to jointly show that their hard work made a difference in society and that it should be recognised. Well done to all of those who were nominated and congratulations to all of those who received an award.

2025, I fear, will face many of the same challenges, but we will be here, and we look forward to continuing the work of The Clare Foundation for many years to come, supporting charities and people across Buckinghamshire.








Founders Fund 2024



TCF Grants 2024








Family Angels Programme







Family Angels was re-established in autumn 2022 by The Clare Foundation and The Clare Family Trust. Through the dedication and expertise of 37 Community Advocates, in 2024 we have provided financial support (£90k) to 126 families across Buckinghamshire. This impact wouldn't have been possible without our vigilant advocates, who remain deeply aware of the needs of vulnerable and at-risk individuals in our community.

One Year Progress Update: One-Eighty: Schools Partnership Programme

One-Eighty: Schools Partnership Programme, worked closely with a primary school in Buckinghamshire to provide much needed support, with aims to improve learning and mental wellbeing.

Impact:

One-Eighty has supported over 60 people in the past year, ranging from young people and families to professionals as a direct result of their Angels Den funding.

Services:

One-Eighty has delivered a suite of services including one-to-one intervention and transitional summer projects.

Outcomes:

Enabled One-Eighty to offer immediate support to a local school.

A strong social return on investment (£11.48 for every £1 invested).

Allowed One-Eighty to double their impact from 2022/23 to 2023/24.

Have since worked with over 1,000 young people in remedial and preventative capacities.

The Oasis Partnership's Knowledge Transfer Partnership with Buckinghamshire New University

Total Grant Amount: £30K over two years awarded through TCF Grants

- Buckinghamshire New University (BNU) Knowledge Transfer Partnership (KTP) aims to support Oasis to develop income generation models that can sustainably support the charity long term.
- Through both formal training and active learning, the KTP will support
 Oasis's Senior Leadership Team to implement a commercially minded
 strategic plan.
- One example of this in action is the utilisation of the café space and workshop, along with innovative partnership models with local business, to generate long-term income for Oasis.
- Another key development within this partnership was the first 'Drug and Alcohol' related conference at BNU, boasting over 120 attendees.
- The outcomes of this collaboration have been so successful that it has prompted the planning of future conferences in 2025!

The Clare Foundation's Impact on Buckinghamshire's Charity Sector (Since 2015)

Since 2015, The Clare Foundation has been dedicated to strengthening the charity sector in Buckinghamshire by bringing together Charity Leaders to network, learn, and collaborate.

Our work seeks to drive positive change through supporting leaders, enabling innovation and encouraging partnership. We achieve this through seminars and workshops for charity personnel, improving their skills and knowledge through education.

2024 Highlights:

- 33 Events Hosted: All tailored to meet the needs of Charity Leaders, offering valuable insights, resources, and networking opportunities.
- 749 Participants Engaged: Through these events, we have directly connected with over 749 individuals, fostering a stronger and more collaborative charity network in Buckinghamshire.





