1. [29 May 1961 Charitable Trust](#) – UK organisations, with priority to those in Warwickshire and London. enquiries@29may1961charity.org.uk
2. [AHF Transforming Places Through Heritage Programme](#) - charities and social enterprises in England, various grant programmes for community-owned historic buildings in town centres.
3. [Albert Hunt Trust](#) – charities with income under £250k, capital, core/running costs, hospice, homeless, health & wellbeing, UK wide, not overseas.
4. [Angus Irvine Playing Fields Fund](#) - to get more people, especially the young and disadvantaged, playing sport through more effective use of playing fields. New investment in playing fields, including drainage, levelling, returfing, ATPs, MUGAs and pavilions.
5. [Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust](#) – Veterans Community Centres Programme - Armed Forces charities for community centres used by veterans and their communities.
6. [Arts Council](#) – small capital grants.
7. [Arts Council](#) – large capital grants.
8. [ASDA Foundation - Significant Local Community Projects](#) - Capital grants in the UK for local charitable projects and activities that benefit the wider community, address local needs and make a significant difference to the local community.
9. [BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme](#) - to meet the needs of UK children living in severe poverty, suffering deprivation as a result and who are facing additional social issues. May fund essential household items.
10. [Beatrice Laing Trust](#) - UK registered charities; relief of poverty and distress in the UK and overseas. Grants generally capital purposes, such as new premises, building extension, redevelopment or refurbishment, or the purchase of equipment and vehicles.
11. [Bernard Sunley Charitable Foundation](#) - registered charities in England and Wales, community, education, health and social welfare projects.
12. [Biffa](#) – community buildings within 5 miles of Biffa operations/sites.
13. [British Cycling Places To Ride Programme](#) - English not-for-profits developing cycling in the community for new, or the improvement of existing, cycling facilities.
14. [Charles Hayward Foundation](#) - project and capital, for various programmes, including older people and social and criminal justice.
15. [Charles Wolfson Charitable Trust](#) - registered charities for work in the fields of medicine, education and welfare, especially for capital projects, particularly for the Jewish community.
16. [Carling Made Local Fund](#) – local community action anything from revamping a local community centre to fixing the facilities of an amateur sports team.

17. **Children in Need** - wide variety of projects from holiday schemes, playground equipment, sports activities and even minibuses with revenue, capital and salary costs.
18. **CLA Charitable Trust** - for organisations in England and Wales to provide facilities for the disabled to take part in country sports and recreation.
19. **Clore Duffield Foundation - Main Grants Programme** - registered charities; cultural sector in the UK and, occasionally, health and social care sectors. Grants can be used for capital redevelopments.
20. **Clothworkers Foundation** - UK registered charities, CICs, and other registered UK not-for-profit organisations (including special schools).
21. **Community Housing Fund** - community-led organisations to support delivery of new affordable homes across England (excluding London) up to March 2020.
22. **Cotton Trust UK** - registered charities undertaking projects or items of specialist equipment, and occasionally for itemised running costs, for the relief of suffering, elimination or control of disease, or assisting people with disabilities and disadvantaged people of all ages.
23. **CRASH** – construction projects, homelessness and hospices, grants and other support.
24. **Dickie Bird Foundation** - individuals in the UK, to help disadvantaged young people (under the age of 16) - essential sports equipment and clothing.
25. **Disabled Facilities Grants** - for individuals.
26. **D M Thoma Foundation** - equipment, training, and support to young people.
27. **Duke of Devonshire's Charitable Trust** - registered charities for local capital projects.
28. **Entrust: Landfill Communities Fund** - public parks, amenities, land restoration, places of worship, habitats, places of architectural importance.
29. **Family Action Welfare Grant** - grants for needs such as cookers, clothing etc. email grants.enquiry@family-action.org.uk.
30. **Fidelity UK Foundation** - London, Kent or Surrey. Health, including disability, palliative care and centres of excellence involved in ground-breaking research and treatments to address chronic illness (with a particular focus on investment in specialist equipment).
31. **F M Global** – grants for fire prevention.
32. **Football Foundation** - Premier League & The FA Facilities Fund Small Grants Scheme - capital items, or to refurbish/improve football facilities in England.
33. **Foyle Foundation** – capital and equipment.
34. **Garfield Weston** – community grants, revenue and capital.
35. **Glaziers Trust** – churches and other public buildings to restore or preserve stained glass.
36. **Greggs Foundation** - community not-for-profit organisations for projects or to provide equipment to people in need at the heart of their local communities.
37. **Grocers Charitable Trust** - bursaries and capital projects for schools.
38. **Headley Trust** - small grants providing practical aids to disabled people.
39. **Heat Networks investment Project** - grants and loans to increase the uptake of low carbon heating network projects for domestic/public buildings in England and Wales.

40. [Heinz, Anna and Carol Kroch Foundation](#) - Grants to support on-going medical conditions from £100 to £500 for hospital travel costs, household items, disability equipment etc. Applications in writing by social worker or other professional.
41. [Help the Homeless Grant Scheme](#) - small and medium-sized registered UK charities to assist homeless people.
42. [Hospital Saturday Fund](#) - registered UK health charities for medical capital projects.
43. [Key Fund – Northern Impact Fund](#) - Unsecured lending (a loan and grant) is available for new and early stage social enterprises based in the North or the Midlands to purchase or renovate buildings.
44. [Kennedy Leigh Charitable Trust](#) - children, young people, disabilities. Will consider capital funding and running costs.
45. [London Marathon Charitable Trust](#) – facilities grants programme, major grants, range of organisations to build, renovate or modernise facilities in London or Surrey which enable people to become and remain physically active.
46. [London Marathon Charitable Trust](#) – facilities grants programme, small grants, renovation, modernisation or creation of local facilities in London or Surrey to support in being physically active.
47. [London Small Theatres Grants Scheme](#) – for urgent building repairs, improve operational viability, introduce environmental improvements, and enhance physical accessibility in London/Greater London.
48. [More than a Pub](#) - Community Pub Business Support Programme - finance package of loans and grants is available to community groups in England that want to take on the ownership of their local pub.
49. [Morrisons Foundation](#) – doesn't say so on their website, but has funded capital items.
50. [The National Churches Trust](#) - list of large grant funders for church buildings.
51. [Percy Bilton Charity- Grants for Organisations](#) - UK registered charities; disadvantaged/underprivileged young people; people with disabilities; older people. Large grants - capital expenditure of £2,000 and over. Preference for specific items of furniture and equipment (excluding office items) which the Charity can fund in their entirety. Small grants - donations of up to £500.
52. [Power to Change](#) - Homes in Community Hands - Grants and support to help community business groups to build or refurbish homes designed around the needs of local people.
53. [Quaker Housing Trust](#) - registered charities carrying out housing projects providing homes for those in need in the UK.
54. [Reaching Communities](#) - £10k+, communities, voluntary and community organisations or social enterprises for up to 5 years; project activities, operating costs, organisational development and capital costs.
55. [Rose Foundation](#) - registered charities and exempt bodies undertaking building projects less than £200,000 in the London area.

56. [Rowing Foundation](#) - rowing in Britain with preference shown to encouraging participation in rowing by the young, through the provision of equipment.
57. [Sainsbury Family Charitable Trusts - Headley Trust](#) - registered UK charities: arts and heritage UK, churches, arts and heritage overseas, developing countries, education, and health and social welfare. Small grants - aids for disabled people.
58. [Screwfix Foundation](#) – up to £5k, repairing buildings and improving facilities.
59. [Seafarers UK](#) - new equipment or refurbishing or building premises.
60. [Skinners Company - Lady Neville Charity](#) - grassroots UK charitable organisations: local heritage, local community; and performing arts and visual arts.
61. [Sport England - Community Asset Fund](#) - to enhance local community spaces which encourage people to play sport and get active.
62. [Sport England Toyota Parasport Fund](#) - not-for-profit providers to purchase specialist equipment to get more disabled people involved in sport and physical activity in England.
63. [Sir Jules Thorn Charitable Trust](#) – core or capital funding for hospices.
64. [St James Place Foundation](#) – UK registered charities with income under £1million pa.
65. [Suez Communities Trust](#) - funding to improve publicly accessible amenities; from a local play area to a nationally significant historic building, each project has the potential to transform the community in which it is based.
66. [Tesco Bags of Help](#) - community and other non-profits groups, capital improvement projects for local community greenspaces: England, Scotland, Wales and NI.
67. [The Bailey Thomas Charitable Fund](#) – learning disability.
68. [The Bradbury Foundation](#) – Hong Kong based, but funds UK charities working with the elderly and the blind.
69. [The Dan Maskell Tennis Trust](#) - UK disabled people to play tennis through the purchase of wheelchairs, tennis equipment and grants for coaching.
70. [The Field Family Charitable Trust \(Woodlands Trust\)](#) - local charities operating in the West Midlands and London within the boundaries of the M25 - vulnerable young people, between the ages of 13-25, and the Elderly. Outreach, engagement, equipment, furnishings, running costs, helplines.
71. [The National Hockey Foundation](#) - capital and operational funding to the sport through clubs and educational establishments in England and by support to England Hockey's youth development activities.
72. [The Rank Foundation](#) – registered charities and churches, where total cost under £1m, average award £1000.
73. [The Rayne Foundation](#) - to ‘understand and engage with the needs of UK society, and to find ways and means to help address those needs’. Funding for salaries and project costs, running costs and capital costs of building and equipment.

74. [The Rainford Trust](#) - welfare, medical, education, environment or religion, within the St Helens Metropolitan Borough Council area and other places in England and Wales where Pilkington Brothers has employees. Funding: Buildings, Capital costs, Projects, Salaries, Start-up costs.
75. [The Wolfson Foundation](#) - new buildings, refurbishment and equipment for hospices.
76. [Talbot Village Trust](#) - registered charities, churches or places of education in Poole, Bournemouth, Christchurch, Isle of Purbeck and East Dorset for local capital projects.

86. [Wesleyan Foundation](#) - education, health and social - start-up costs for new organisations or projects, pilot projects, purchase of equipment and resources.
87. [W.G. Edwards Charitable Foundation](#) - registered charities providing care for older people in the UK. Capital projects, refurbishment and for equipment, in addition to innovative schemes for ongoing care and projects.
88. [Whole House Retrofit \(WHR\) Innovation Competition](#) - projects that reduce the cost of retrofitting domestic properties in the UK to the same standard as new builds.
